

Five Common Summer Lightning Myths

Summer storms don't just bring rain—they can also unleash dangerous lightning. Staying safe starts with understanding the facts. Here are five common lightning myths—and the truth behind them.

1. Myth: Lightning never strikes the same place twice.

Truth: Lightning can—and often does—strike the



2. Myth: Lightning only occurs during thunderstorms.

Truth: Lightning usually forms during thunderstorms, but it doesn't need to be raining to pose a risk. "Dry lightning" can strike miles away from a storm's center—even under blue skies. Lightning has also been recorded during snowstorms and volcanic eruptions.

3. Myth: Lightning is only a danger outdoors.

Truth: Lightning can travel into buildings through plumbing, wiring, and even phone lines. During a storm, avoid using corded phones, showers, faucets, and electronic devices connected to power outlets. While rare, lightning can also enter through windows—so it's best to close them during a storm.

4. Myth: Don't touch someone struck by lightning—they're electrified.

Lightning strike victims do not carry an electrical charge. It is safe—and essential—to help them immediately. In the U.S., around 200 to 300 people are struck each year, and 20 to 40 of those incidents are fatal. Call 911, and if the person isn't breathing or has no pulse, begin CPR right away. Quick action can save lives.

5. Myth: Lightning won't strike water.

Truth: Lightning can and does strike water. Boating, swimming, or standing in shallow water during a storm is extremely dangerous. A lightning strike on water can injure or kill people and animals nearby. If you hear thunder, head indoors or seek shelter immediately.

Final Thought: Lightning is unpredictable and deadly. When thunder roars, go indoors—and stay there until 30 minutes after the last rumble. Don't let myths put you at risk.
